GHI BUDGET PROPOSAL ADOPTED MONTHLY CHARGES, FEES RAISED

Increases in monthly charges and in a variety of fees and charges were voted by the Greenbelt Homes, Inc. board of directors on Thursday, December 14, in order to balance the 1968 budget. The increase in monthly charges for brick homes will range from \$1.25 to \$2.75, while for frame homes it will be from \$2 to \$3. The larger increase for frame homes is primarily due to rising maintenance costs.

The board adopted without change the proposed budget submitted to it on December 7 and described in last week's News Review. Before adoption, the GHI board took final action on a series of recommendations by the manager relating to charges for services that are not covered by the mutual ownership contract. These include:

1) Increase in monthly charges for sale of services to members from \$4 to \$4.50.

2) Increase in hourly charge for sale of services to GDC (apartments owned by GHI) from \$6 to \$7.

3) Increase in sales service fee charged the selling member for each sale made by GHI from 21/2% to 31/2%, effective with all listings after Jan. 1, 1968.

4) Adoption of a \$50 administration fee for services rendered to a member handling his home's sale by himself.

5) Increase in application fee from \$5 to \$7.50 so as to cover fully expense of credit check for membership.

6) Adoption of \$25 fee charge for service rendered by corporation in evaluation of suggested selling price. Members selling through GHI wil not be subject to this charge.

7) Adoption of a \$10 fee for each request for a name change on a mutual ownership contract.

All these changes to go into effect Jan. 1, 1968.

The total budget amounted to \$1,715,400, an increase of \$85,600 from the 1967 budget. Of this increase \$51,500 is to come from monthly charges.

Discussion

Discussion on the budget was minimal, as the board had exhausted the subject in three prior budget meetings. Director Cliff Simonson suggested that the rate of recovery for amounts advanced from reserves for capital improvements be speeded up. The budget calls for these amounts to be recovered over a 10-year period, and Simonson suggested a 5-year period instead. The majority of the board felt, however ,that it should first await the results of a study by the finance committee on the use and level of reserves. Treasurer John O'Reilly said that the problem is not so much building up reserves as making most effective use of the existing ones and of other funds.

A member of the audience inquired whether the board had taken sufficient account of inflationary forces in the coming year. Board members observed that two of the factors most affecting GHI costs are wages and materials. The wage factor, it was noted, had been taken care of by the pay raise just voted, and provisions for increases in cost of materials have been included in the budget.

Manager Roy Breashears also noted that another important factor affecting GHI costs is weather, and this has nothing to do with inflationary forces.

GDC Meeting

Prior to convening as the board of GHI, the directors met as the board of Greenbelt Development Corporation (GDC), a whollyowned subsidiary of GHI which manages several apartment buildings in Greenbelt. The GDC board voted its intent to pay an \$8,000 dividend to GHI when the cash funds became available. The cash accrued for this purpose had been advanced by the corporation to finance certain capital improvements and major repairs (roof work and boiler work), pending the approval of a long-range borrowing program.

Statement of City Council

Concerning the Recent Court of Appeals Decision

Relating to Covenants and Agreements

The City Council reviewed with mixed emotions the recent Court of Appeals decision relative to the covenants and agreements in Charlestowne Village. We were pleased to learn that the Court of Appeals upheld the City's right to enter into such covenants and agreements, thus establishing new law in the State of Maryland which will be of benefit to all municipalities in this County by enabling them to contract for desirable development and enforce promises made by developers. We are further pleased that the Court returned to the Circuit Court for trial the City's suit to obtain the conveyance of park land.

We are distressed, however, that the Court of Appeals ruled against the City in holding that the injunction proceeding to stop building construction was not filed within the time period specified in the covenant. The record clearly shows that the Council followed closely the developments taking place in Charlestowne Village and on several occasions referred the matter to the City Mgr. and the City Solicitor. On January 17, 1967, immediately upon learning of the taking out of building permits and upon the advice of the City Solici-tor, the Council, by unanimous motion, directed the City Mgr. to instruct the City Solicitor to file suit. Although several inquiries were made subsequently, we are extremely distressed that this direction of Council, upon the forward. Council was not followed through.

It should be noted, however, that in January of 1967 there were certain factors that tended to make the filing time of less importance than later developments and the ruling of the Court of Appeals gave to the question.

1. The City never was notified by the Breslers that the covenant would not be honored. Bresler does contend that he did send a letter to the City Manager notifying that he took out permits, but this letter, which was never received by the City Manager, did not indicate that the covenant was being violated and the Court of Appeals chose not to rule on whether or not this letter was proper notice. It was not until after the suit was filed that the City Solicitor, the City Manager and City Council learned of the letter's existence.

2. The development control committee, which was the Mayor and Council, was never advised of nor ever approved any modification of the covenant, as was required.

3. There was serious doubt as to whether or not the taking out of permits had violated the covenant for the covenant permitted the construction of 353 units and permits had been issued for only 326 units

The Court of Appeals chose not to give weight to these factors in reaching its decision. However, they did have a bearing on actions at the time.

The City is still in court as relates to the agreement of the Bres-lers to convey 3.3 acres of park land. The Court of Appeals held that this agreement was completely valid and remanded it to the Circuit Court for trial. Thus our battle is not entirely lost.

The City Council has met with the City Manager and the City Solicitor and reviewed several possible courses of action. The City Solicitor has been instructed to have the specific performance suit relating to the agreements set for trial at the earliest possible date.


