Pilski, Tom White File for Council; Monday Is Deadline for Candidates

The latest two candidates to file their nomination petitions for city council are incumbent Richard N. Pilski, 106 Rosewood Dr., and Thomas X. White, 8 Woodland Way. They join the already-announced candidates of Leo Gerton, Francis White, and John Bogumill.

The election for the five-man council will be held on Tuesday, September 16, but all nominating petitions must be filed by the close of working day, Monday, August 18. The biographies of Pilski and Thomas White follow.

Pilski

Richard Pilski, a native of Kingston, Pa., moved to Greenbelt ten years ago. He and his wife Claire, a registered nurse, have three children. For the past eleven years, Pilski has been employed as a Tax Representative for Prentice Hall, Inc., Englewood Cliffs, N.J. Before joining Prentice Hall he held the position of Merchandising manager for the American Tobacco Co. Pilski attended Kings College, Wilkes Barre, Pa. He holds a B.S. degree in Business Administration from Syracuse University. He served three years in the U.S. Navy.

Pilski, an incumbent member of the City Council, is also a former member of the Advisory Planning Board, Charter Review Committee, Greenbelt Dedication Committee, Board of Directors of Greenbelt Federal Credit Union, and member of St. Hugh's School Board. He is also past president of the Lakewood Citizens Association. He has served on the Environmental Health Committee, and presently serves on the Traffic Safety Committee of the Council of Governments.

He is currently active in the Greenbelt American Legion Post 136, serving as a member of the Americanism Commission, a Counselor to Prince Georges County Boy Scouts and Greenbelt Troop 746. He is also a member of "Lambda Chi Alpha" Fraternity and Knights of Columbus.

White

Thomas X. White is a lifelong area resident. He attended Gonzaga College High School and studied at Georgetown University before entering the Navy in 1954. He served five years as a Navy Hospital Corpsman and is now an active Naval Reservist, performing his drills at nearby Adelphi, Md. White attended the University of

Voting Registration Closes August 18

Monday, August 18, is the last day to register to vote in the coming city council election. The city clerk's office will be open to 4:40 p.m. that day. Special hours for registration will also be held on Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at three polling places — Municipal offices, North End Elementary School, and Springhill Lake Community Center.

To register to vote, one must be a citizen of the U.S., be at least 21 years of age, and must have lived in Greenbelt at least six months immediately preceding the election on September 16.

Those citizens who have voted in at least one of the two previous regular city elections need not register again, as long as they have lived continuously in Greenbelt.

The city election will feature the election of five city councilmen. Each voter is entitled to vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies to be filled.

A candidate is elected if he receives more than 40 percent of the votes cast. If fewer than five candidates receive more than 40 percent of the vote, a "run-off" election is held one week later among those top candidates failing to get the necessary plurality.

Firearm Control Referendum To Be Added to City Ballot

In the city election of September 16, Greenbelt voters will have an opportunity to express themselves on the question: "Shall the City Council of Greenbelt, Maryland, advise the members of the Maryland General Assembly, the Governor and the Attorney General that it is the desire of the electorate of Greenbelt to have enacted new legislation to extend existing firearm control laws?" This was the major outcome of Monday's special meeting of city council, resulting from a citizens' petition brought before council the previous week.

The original motion, as made by councilman Leo Gerton and seconded by Councilman Francis White, would have advised State officials that "it is the desire of the electorate of Greenbelt to have vigorous enforcement and prosecution, under existing legislation, for the registration of firearms and regulation of their use, and to have enacted new legislation to extend and strengthen existing firearm control legislation." The revised wording was accepted by Theodore Reiss, who had presented the original petition.

Councilman William Hoff, who chaired the meeting in the absence of Mayor Edgar Smith, questioned the generality of the original wording. He compared regulation of guns with regulation of drugs, and quoted a Maryland professor as saying that at best one could only hope for particular results, such as elimination of mail-order guns.

The debate from the floor which followed brought out - again opinions for and against gun control laws; White pointed out that the discussion was not about the pros and cons of gun control, but about the question of having the voters express themselves on the issue. Harold Zapolsky, 7884 Lakecrest, noted that many arguments are heard on this issue, and said "I really want to know how my neighbors in Greenbelt feel." Councilman Richard Pilski felt that the wording was the important thing. With regard to the original motion, he thought everyone would support the first part but wondered about the second. Thomas White, 21-E Ridge, also thought the second part of the question was too broad, and asked what a "no" vote would actually mean.

After further discussion from the floor about separating the question into two parts, White announced that he would withdraw his seconding of the motion, "though I am still in favor of it in principle." Chairman Hoff then called a five minute recess. After the recess, the motion to place the revised question (essentially the second part of the original) on the ballot was made by Pilski and seconded by Hoff. Reiss stated that this new wording was acceptable to him, and council promptly passed it unanimously.

Other Business

Acting on the city manager's recommendation, and after a brief discussion of the architect's fee. council voted to employ the firm of Greenhorne and O'Mara to prepare plans and specifications for the construction of the Youth Center addition. On Thursday, Aug. 21, a subcommittee of the Legislative council of the state legislature will be holding a hearing at District Heights on classification of cities. Council agreed to instruct the city's representative that classification should be based on population primarily, but that consideration should also be given to other factors, such as services provided and area. Council also agreed to take no position on the first draft on "home rule" charter prepared by the Prince Georges County Charter Board, since according to the city manager's report, Greenbelt would not be affected by any of its provisions. Hoff suggested that council continue to send a representative to future hearings.




