City Initiates Discussion with WSSC **On Greenbriar Sewage Pumping Station**

by Virginia Beauchamp A letter dated August 20 from Greenbelt Mayor Gil Weidenfeld to Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission Chairman Lawrence L. Brooks, Sr. has asked for "an early meeting" of WSSC with Greenbriar residents and the city council. The letter follows a unanimous council decision at a special meeting on August 18, with full support of the board of the Greenbriar Recreation Association, who also sent a letter, to seek WSSC take-over and operation of the private sewage pumping station currently serving the condominium development.

This decision was precipitated by an event on August 14 when breakdown in one of the pumps, occurring in such a way as to bypass the automatic alarm signal, resulted in a flood of raw sewage through four apartments and some storage rooms in the development. This was the third, but far and away the most serious, breakdown of the private pumping station. Until an auxiliary pump could be installed, water for the 1,193 apartments in the development had to be turned off for 22 hours.

The Weidenfeld letter cites efforts made in December 1975 to WSSC operation of the seek pumping station - action which was several times "deferred." In January 1976, Weidenfeld wrote, the city council "urged the Commission to seek a solution that would serve best the public interest and the homeowners' interests." Council felt then that the station should be upgraded by the developer and then operated and maintained by WSSC. "I am not aware that the Commission ever considered the city's request," the Weidenfeld letter states.

Instead, in April 1976 WSSC and the Greenbriar developer, Alan Kay, signed an agreement in which the Commission "relinquished claims for payment against the developer" and in which the developer agreed to upgrade, operate and maintain the pumping station according to WSSC specifications-an obligation which has since been assumed by the condoSteve Bupp, condominium manager, a recent title search revealed that the land on which the pumping station sits is owned by the WSSC. The question of who owns the control building, valve vault and dry wells remains unanswered.

History Researched

Council and the city staff have had to do some searching through old records since the August 18, 1980 meeting to recall specific details of the long controversial history of the Greenbriar private sewage treatment plant and later the pumping station. At the meeting all professed to have only "hazy" memories of the pumping station. The sewage treatment plant had dominated the agenda of many city council meetings from 1971 to 1974 until the first residents moved in on October 22, 1974. The pumping station became a major topic, as the Weidenfeld letter indicates, in late 1975-early 1976.

The present Greenbriar pumping station issue is a legacy of the moratorium on sewage connections imposed in May 1970 by State Chief Health Officer Dr. Neil Solomon, During this period no new sewer authorizations were permitted until the Western Branch sewage treatment plant was expanded. (Completion date was slated for 1973 but construction dragged on until 1977.) Only pre-moratorium approvals were allowed.

Greenbriar developer Alan Kay, whose project was by then financially committed, sought to continue in spite of the moratorium. From the start he ran into snags. In July 1971 the project was denied a pumping station using the Anacostia drainage basin. An alternate plan to transfer sewage from the Anacostia to the Western Branch was unsuccessful, as well as the attempt to transfer pre-moratorium sewage rights from another property to Greenbriar. Studies by Kay's consultants claiming that there would be increased sewage capacity with the addition of chemical treatment was not accepted at the time. Additionally, new county regulations prohibited the issuance of building permits, even of a conditional nature, until sewer service

City Opposition

Throughout this period the city, supported by a citizens' group, Save Our Community Committee, opposed the idea of the plant. Kay persisted, however, eventually gaining approvals from various federal, state, and county agencies involved. NASA had to grant an easement to carry a pipe across its property. The Environmental

WSSC PREPARING REPORT

In response to letters from the city and the Greenbriar Recreation Association, the staff of WSSC will prepare a report for the Commission dealing with the private Greenbriar pumping station. In its evaluation, the staff will study the station's present condition, determine if any upgrading is required and work out possible financial arrangements before any decision is made for WSSC to agree to take over the station. A meeting among the parties is also expected to take place.

The private Greenbriar station is considered unique because it serves so many residential units-1,193. According to WSSC spokesman Arthur Brigham, the condominium boom led the Commission several years ago to establish procedures for WSSC's take-over of on-site systems at the request of the owners. This was necessary because of difficulties management was encountering with maintenance.

In February 1980, the Greenbriar Recreation Association, the umbrella organization for Phases I, II and III and Glen Oaks apartment units, asked WSSC what it would charge to maintain and operate the station. After learning that a \$25,000 yearly fee would only cover checking the station any repairs or replacements to be borne by the condominium cwners-GRA opted to retain operation and maintenance of the station.

Greenbelt Ranks Fourth in Expenditures Compared To Nine State Municipalities

A comparative study of Greenbelt's financial standing in relation to eight other Maryland communities whose populations exceed 10,000 was recently prepared by Assistant City Manager Dennis E. Piendak. The study was drawn from tables which Piendak drew up from figures gathered by the Maryland State Department of Fiscal Services and published in a booklet, Local Government Finances in Maryland.

According to a covering letter with his analysis, directed to City Manager James K. Giese, Piendak notes that the figures were collected from a uniform financial report required of all municipalities in the state. It covered the period ending June 30, 1979. Piendak's analysis is limited to cities comparable to Greenbelt in Prince Georges and Montgomery Counties. The eight other cities are: Bowie, College Park, Gaithersburg, Hyattsville, Laurel, New Carrollton, Rockville, and Takoma Park.

Of the nine communities, Greenbelt ranked fifth in estimated population at 19,606. New Carrollton, with 13,125, was smallest and Rockville was largest at 45,608.

Although Greenbelt was only seventh in assessable tax base for FY 1979, it was fourth in the amount of increase (4.6) since the preceding year. Gaithersburg, with 12.1 was highest. (Four of the group-New Carrollton, Hyattsville, Bowie, and College Park-showed assessable base decreases for the same period.) Greenbelt's assessable tax base was \$95,177,110. As would be expected, Rockville's was highest with \$569,042,846.

Greenbelt was fourth highest among the group of nine cities in the FY 79 tax rate. Piendak attributed this fact to two causes: (1) the high level of police services for this city and (2) the smaller size of the assessable tax base.

Two cities with lower tax rates have no police departments, two have only minor police expenditures, and the fifth, Hyattsville, spent only \$409,853 as compared to Greenbelt's \$614,157 for police services.

The size of the assessable tax base, Piendak notes, has a "direct relation" to tax rate. While Hyattsville's tax rate (\$.90) was lower than Greenbelt's (\$.97), the former's larger assessable base produced about \$44,000 more in revenue than Greenbelt's.

Greenbelt's ratio of bonded debt (0.9%) was fourth among seven municipalities that reported



debt. The range was from 0.03% (New Carrollton) to 5.4 (Rockville). Both Hyattsville and Gaithersburg reported no bonded debt.

The range for net bonded debt per capita was similar, with New Carrollton's lowest at \$2, Rockville's highest at \$672 and Greenbelt's in fourth place at \$43.

Revenues Six communities collected more local property taxes than Green belt. In FY 79 local property taxes accounted for 36.7% of Greenbelt's total revenue. New Carrollton, Bowie, College Park and Rockville all showed a lower percentage. Piendak noted, how ever, that Bowie's water system and College Park's urban renewal program brought in federal grant money and service charges. Rockville also received federal monies. Total revenues from such sources for the three cities ranged from 35.5% to 61.9%, as compared with only 13.4% for Greenbelt in that year.

Greenbelt was fourth in the amount of income tax received in FY 79 but last in other state shared taxes-a circumstance resulting from Greenbelt's low street mileage as compared to the other municipalities. Street mileage is closely related to highway user revenues, Piendak noted.

In Federal Revenue Sharing, Greenbelt ranked eighth. Expenditures

general government services. But the New Carrollton figure represents 14.9% of total expenditures. as contrasted with Greenbelt's 10.8".. (Piendak did not provide percentage figures for the other cities.)

Although Greenbelt was third, behind only Rockville and Takoma Park, in expenditures for public safety, the Greenbelt figure included the one-time expense for funding for the new addition to the Fire House.

As previously noted, Greenbelt. ranking third, also carries rela tively higher costs for police pro tection. Per capita police expenditures ranged from lows of \$3.48 (New Carrollton) and \$3.81 (Gaithersburg) to a high of \$38.04 (Takoma Park). The Greenbelt figure is \$31.32.

Greenbelt's expenditure for public works-\$535,376-was next lowest to New Carrollton's. Greenbelt's costs for public works were lower than expenditures for both public safety and recreation and parks. (In six of the other cities, public works expenditures exceeded those for the other two categories.) Greenbelt's recreation and parks expenditures were third highest among the nine cities. Rockville spent \$68.17 per capita, Gaithersburg \$31 and Greenbelt \$28.84 - three times more than Laurel which, like Greenbelt (but unlike the others), is not in the MNCPPC Park District.

PUMPING STATION fr. p. 1 Protection Agency had to certify that plans for the plant met standards of the Water Pollution Control Act. Dr. Solomon had to give State authorization for construction of the plant.

In addition, the District Council (the then County Commissioners sitting as a zoning body) okayed a change in the original site plan for the development to include the treatment plant, even though the change violated the County's green-space zoning regulations. The County Board of Appeals then reconfirmed the approval decision after city opposition and that of the Prince Georges Environmental Coalition, a citizens' group, had been filed.

Following a substantial payment by the Greenbriar developers to WSSC in August 1974 for tests, insurance, and labor, and following a 10-day operational test in September, WSSC approved the plant on October 9, 1974.

After the first residents moved into Greenbriar, the subject of the sewage treatment plant disappeared from the city council agenda and the pages of the News Review until January 1976. At that time, although the plant's operation had been declared "excellent" and the moratorium was still in effect, WSSC was urged to approve its dismantling and the permanent connection of Greenbriar to the public Western Branch system. This was possible because of an interim chemical treatment process that provided additional sewage capacity.

New Pumping Station Planned In connection with the conversion from the private plant to the hook-up with the public system, WSSC had been planning construction of a public pumping station to serve Greenbriar and other nearby vacant land in the same drainage basin. Cost estimates were from \$750,000 to \$1,000,000three-fourths of which would be charged to the Greenbriar developers. To avoid these costs, Kay, suported by the city, requested WSSC to forego construction of the new facility. He also wanted WSSC either to take over the present pumping station or permit Greenbriar to continue its operation as a private facility. The city was consistent in pressing for the pumping station to be brought into the public system.

Biggest news of the week is the possibility of a change from the mineral siding to vinyl siding on the frame homes. There have been problems with the mineral siding now being used both in the material itself and in its installation, GHI will meet with the Maryland Historical Trust and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation to inform them of these problems and to seek a change.
