

GHI Studies Moisture Problems

Moisture and mildew in the block homes and extension of the vinyl siding contract were main items on the packed agenda for the December 16 Greenbelt Homes Incorporated Development Corporation (GHIDC) and the Greenbelt Homes Inc. (GHI) Board of Directors meetings. In the absence of Board President Jim Smith, Vice President Margaret Hogensen presided at both.

Moisture

The board heard both members and staff describe severe moisture and mildew problems in at least 35 block homes. Members reported mold and mildew in closets, on walls and on furniture and hangings placed against the walls. One member associated her children's respiratory illness with the bacteria from the moisture buildup. The problem appears to be the result of changes to the homes made during the rehabilitation program. Installation of thermal windows has made the homes more air tight and made it harder for moisture to escape. Unusually mild weather with high humidity is also a factor. General Manager Tim Mitter described the investi-

gation and efforts made by staff to correct the situation. Staff architect Stan Sersen reported that the issue is complex and that there are a number of possible solutions, some of which have been at least partially successful in some instances and other solutions which need to be tested. Management recommended and board approved the hiring of a consultant, at a fee not to exceed \$20,000, with expertise in this area to set up test equipment, compile data, and develop potential solutions. The board also unanimously approved a motion by director Wayne Williams that management prepare a detailed, written report describing all the information currently known about the problem as a resource for the consultant. While many board members expressed the need for quick action, they also acknowledged that hiring a consultant was no automatic cure, but simply a step in the right direction.

The board approved an extension of the contract with Mead Aluminum for the vinyl siding on GHI frame homes. The contract now calls for siding to be completed by January 31.

A number of items were postponed to a later meeting.



He was a member of the Greenbelt Community Church and American Legion Post 136. In World War II, he participated in the Normandy landing and the landing at Lingayen Gulf in the Philippines.

Mr. Hooper had been retired for two years. He enjoyed sports, fishing, and especially yard work.

He leaves his wife, Louise, residing at 3-H Ridge Road, and two sons, Steve and Stanley.




