Co-op Seeks to Sell Food Store And Gas Station by March 1984

Two fixtures of Greenbelt life since the earliest days of the city - the Co-op grocery store (including its pharmacy) and the Co-op gas station - have a most uncertain future. The Board of Directors of the parent organization, Greenbelt Co-operative, Inc. (GCI), decided on December 17 that GCI will divest itself of its money-losing supermarket and service station divisions, if possible by the end of March. At the same time, the board directed GCI's operating management to develop preliminary plans for major expansion of its only remaining operating division, the profitable SCAN furniture stores; to work out criteria for GCI to enter into an unspecified new business; to reduce overhead; and to develop "capital and organizational structure" plans, including stock conversion or repurchase.

According to a written GCI statement of the board decision, "Operating management is directed to provide by March 1... complete plans for divesting by March 1, 1984, with no sale to be effective until March 31, 1984, and with the first option to be available to an existing cooperative, community, member and/or employee group, provided that such a cooperative or group has submitted a credit-worthy proposal as accepted by a financial institution by the first of March 1984."

Besides the facilities in Greenbelt, GCI has four other food stores and three other service stations in Maryland and Virginia affected by the divestiture decision.

A December 23 release by GCI, together with a News Review telephone interview with GCI's President and Chief Executive Officer, Robert Satake, have provided additional information about the impending changes.

Losses

Over the past 13 years, the food and service station divisions have had combined average losses of \$700,000 a year. The deficit for the five food stores alone in 1982 was \$538,000, with the 1983 loss expected to be slightly less. According to Satake, the situation could be expected to worsen in 1984 because a substantial employee health and welfare benefits increase costing \$125,000 is scheduled to go into effect, and because the employee union contract expires at the end of January. Satake's assumption is that contract negotiations could be expected to result in a wage increase for employees, thus adding to operating losses.

Chairman of the Board Paul O. Mohn is quoted as expressing regret about the unanimous Board decision, but as adding, "Despite hard work by our employees and concerted efforts by management, these divisions (food and service stations) have not been viable. Over the past 20 years Greenbelt Cooperative has tried a number of different marketing and merchandising options 10 provide our members food and petroleum goods, but none have been completely successful."

Greenbelt's Co-Op

The GCI release cites Satake as recognizing the particular importance of the Co-Op food store to Greenbelt residents. According to the release, Satake has said the GCI goal is to sell the store to some other supermarket operator or a community group that would continue to operate a food store in the Center. In the words of the release, "Within the next week. Satake said, GCI will begin work with the community if there is an interest to take over the food store."

The GCI release refers to the "closing" of the food and service station divisions. However, Satake, in talking to the News Review, emphasized strongly that "We are not going to close the stores. . . . We are going to keep them open until we find a buy-er." He expressed his belief that the food stores could be sold to an independent buyer within a short time, although he said he had no one specifically in mind. He repeated the priority given by the GCI board to community groups, other cooperatives, members or employees as possible purchasers, but volunteered his own realization that purchase by a community group is not too feasible.

Co-Op Employees

According to the GCI release, "Satake noted the commitment of the Cooperative to help employees of the divisions being closed. In Greenbelt 21 fulltime and 15 parttime people will be affected. "We are keenly aware of the hardship these closings have on our employees,' said Satake. 'We will place as many employees as possible elsewhere within the organization, and we are developing an out-placement program to help those we cannot place.'"

Satake, in answer to News Review questions on December 23, said there had not been any official talks yet with employees, but that a meeting with employees is to be scheduled after January 1. He also said there would be no negotiations toward a new union contract to replace the one that expires January 31, labelling such negotiations

"moot" in view of the divestiture decision.

Decision Final

Satake told the News Review that the GCI board had been working through most of 1983 to reach its decisions on divestiture and future directions to be taken by the 75,000-member cooperative. In reply to a question, he said there is no provision in GCI bylaws requiring membership approval of the board's decisions, or permitting a challenge by referendum to the decisions. According to Satake, the decisions made by the board in this matter are final. He suggested that in view of the continuing operating losses, the membership could have found the board remiss in its duties if it had not reached the decisions it did.

Asked about the timing of the public announcement, Satake termed it unfortunate that rumors about the decisions had forced public disclosure before GCI staff could get a complete plan of action in place.
