GHI Members Disagree on Garage Roofs Board Seeks Lower Pitch as Compromise

The design of the garage roofs now being replaced was the main topic of discussion at the Sept. 13 meeting of the board of directors of Greenbelt Homes, Inc. The flat roofs of the original design are being replaced with roofs which are pitched. In July the Aesthetics and Environment Committee strongly recommended that future garage roof replacements adhere to the original design and that the pitched roofs already installed be removed and the flat roofs restored.

Both sides of the controversy had supporters among board members and other who attended the meeting. Letters from Martha E. Sinden (strongly pro-flat roof) and Ottilie van Allen (strongly opposed to removing roofs already replaced) were read. One observation about the new roofs which was made by several speakers (including President Margaret Hogensen and Director Don Volk) was that they are more obtrusive than the flat

Speakers on the other side included member Steve Curtis, who said that he had recently visited Greenhill, Ohio (a sister "green" town to Greenbelt), where almost all flat roofs on residents and garages had been replaced. According to Curtis, the primary reason for the replacement was that the flat roofs "were ugly" and maintenance was high.

Both Directors Frank Gervasi and Mac Wirick asked whether the slope of the roofs could be lowered in order to reduce their visual obtrusiveness. Assistant General Manager Gary Morningstar said this could probably be done. On a motion by Director Debbie Hartwick, the board voted 6 to 1 to continue replacing flat roofs with pitched roofs, with the pitch reduced if possible. Director Volk voted against the motion; Director Ray McCawley, who arrived later, was not present for this vote. A motion by Director Janet Cantwell to refer the whole question of the garages' appearance (color, landscaping, doors) to the Aesthetics and Environment Committee was passed unanimously.

Lions' White Cane Days

The Lion's Club White Cane days to help the eye bank and persons with serious vision problems have been scheduled for two weekends. Friday and Saturday, September 28 and 29 and October 5 and 6. Lions will be stationed throughout Greenbelt to collect. Proceeds will help the eye bank.

PARADE ON TV

The videotape of this year's Labor Day Parade will be cable-cast on Channel A-6 on Tuesday and Thursday, October 2 and 4. Showtime for each day will be 8 p.m. Other Labor Day Festival programs will be cablecast later in October.

Turning to money matters, the board authorized payment of property taxes, which amounted to almost \$600,000. Except for rehab loan repayments, property taxes are the largest single item in the GHI budget.

Budget Schedule

The 1985 budget schedule was presented to the board by management as follows: The first presentation to the board will be made at the regular meeting on October 11; presentation to the membership will be on October 23 in the city council room and will be televised. The second presentation to the board is scheduled for October 25 and final approval is expected on Nov. 8. Both last dates are also regular board meetings.

The board also approved the Rules and Regulations sections dealing with antennas, swimming pools and ornamental ponds and parking spaces. Regulations dealing with pets were presented for the board's review and will be on a future agenda. In regard to the parking regulations, member Lucille Jacoby questioned whether upkeep of in-court parking areas should be a shared cost since

spaces in courts are reserved for court residents. She pointed out that many members live in courts which have no in-court parking at all and are forced to park on the street. Such members must share the cost of maintaining parking areas in which they are not allowed to park. The question was discussed but no definite answer about the issue was given.

The board authorized payment of the expenses of five persons to attend the National Association of Housing Cooperatives in Boston. The five persons who will attend are Hogensen, Morningstar, GHI Comptroller Don McGinn, the newly named General Manager Ronald Colton, and NAHC board member Tony McCarthy.

Morningstar also announced to the board that GHI had been selected as the recipient of the first Urban Forester of the Year Award conferred by the Prince Georges County Forestry Board. The award is for GHI's efforts in maintaining and conserving its forest area. Maintenance Superintendent Joe Whalen will accept the award for GHI on October 2.

Parasitology Institute Target of Virulent Strain of Vandals

Officials at the Beltsville Agricultural Research Center Animal Parasitology Institute, a quarantined area, have reported that during August and September a shotgun and experiment records were stolen, livestock were mixed, and buildings, equipment and automobiles were vandalized.

Prior to August 21 only four minor incidents had been re-

The Center's security staff is now on "emergency standby" with many officers working overtime in order to increase security of the area, according to Ray Rhodes, assistant director of the Beltsville area. He also said that two additional officers will be hired.

Several of the buildings at the 400 acre institute contain frozen germ plasm valued in the hundreds of thousands of dollars and research chemicals that could be fatal to humans if improperly handled.

Out of about 200 buildings only eight are "hot", Rhodes said. A hot building is one which contains "chemicals that need sophisticated handling."

On September 7 in addition to stealing a government shotgun, the vandals broke each of the 98 panes of glass in the building's windows, smashed seven late model trucks with sledge hammer and axe, and put an axe into a typewriter.

Earlier incidents include the Aug. 27 vandalizing of the care-taker's office, located in a swine barn. Here furniture was damaged, records, locks and master keys for field pen locks were stolen.

On August 22 juveniles were observed beating sheep with

sticks. And on August 23 and 26 sheep were moved from their pens and allowed to mix.

"It's hard for me to rationalize that kind of vandalism," said Rhodes. "I don't know what gets into a person."

"If you're having a breeding project and something like this happens, it can really screw up an experiment," he said.

Rhodes indicated that some of the incidents could have been caused by a disgruntled employee but he did not believe that could be the case in all of them because teenagers had been seen.

"Ideally there would be no one in that area that has not been trained to deal with dangerous substances," he said.

The vandals have entered through holes cut in the fence which surrounds the institute, according to Rhodes.

Once a hole has been cut into the fence local animals can enter the research area. These animals if caught are not allowed to leave because of possible exposure to disease. According to Rhodes they are often killed.

Although this may seem harsh, he said it is necessary to protect the surrounding life from possible exposure.

"Our mission here is research. We are not in the park service,"

REVIEWS PRAISE GREENBELT PLAY

Three reviews in county newspapers propel "Butterflies Are Free" into its last weekend at the Utopia Theater.
