Greenbelt's Architectural Charette Starts Move Toward Center Redesign

Members of the Greenbelt city council and city staff, citizens and architects — perhaps 40 people total — met on Thursday, March 7, to plan a charette for the Center Mall.

A charette is derived from the French and refers to a short, intense period of time in which architects work on a design. Drawings are finished when the time is up. Originally, architectural students in France were given, for example, 48 hours to work on a project. At the end of that period, the professor would march down the aisle with a cart - called a charette which the students would place their drawings. The process is still used in architectural schools today and has been adapted to community projects.

Architect Sibley Jennings and Susan Frey, editor of the American Society of Landscape Architecture's magazine, co-chaired the meeting, explaining to the uninitiated the procedures for conducting a charette.

Jennings reminded those present that the object of performing a charette was, first, to have fun. He assured the group that only if the process were spontaneous would they be happy with the result. Also, he said, "You will run it yourselves. There is no way anyone from outside can tell you what to do. The community will decide what it wants. The technicians merely carry out your design."

Many questions were asked concerning the scope of the charette. City Manager James Giese wanted to know if the architects envisioned going beyond the Center Mall to consider other parts of the city. And who would pick the jury to decide on the winning designs? "I would like someone from the city to be on the jury," Giese said, wryly reminding those present that "the city has to deal with what the landscape architects leave behind."

George Christacos, owner of the Center, also cautioned that designs should be practical and affordable. A pretty design isn't worth much if it isn't practical, he stated.

Those present then broke up into three groups. One group will design and conduct a survey to obtain a cross-section of citizen ideas on the Roosevelt Mall. If

the mall is to be redesigned, how should it look? What kinds of stores or services do people want? What does the Center say about Greenbelt? What are the major problems? Crime? Parking? Sidewalks in disrepair?

A second group will plan the crientation and logistics prior to the charette. They will provide a history of the city and relate important points about the community to the nonresidents. They also will conduct a tour of the city as well as of the Center and prepare the design group as much as possible to understand the many facets of the community. As part of this phase, a town meeting is planned.

A third group will plan what will happen during the charette, when it will be, who will participate. A number of architects and planners have joined this group, some hoping to participate in the design process itself. Following the design phase — the actual charette—a jury will judge the drawings.

The groups will be planning the charette over the next several weeks and a tentative date of June 2, Greenbelt Day, has been selected for the judging to occur.

GHI Board Sets Deadlines for Annual Meeting

At the February 28 meeting of the board of directors of Greenbelt Homes, Inc., the board began planning for the annual meeting of the membership on May 22. A schedule of deadlines in preparation for the meeting was presented. The first of these dates is the defadline for putting an item on the agenda by petition. Such petitions must reach Janet Cantwell, Secretary of the Board of Directors, by midnight Saturday, April 27. Notice of the meeting and agenda will be mailed to members between May 2 and May 12; May 12 is also the date for publicly posting the list of prospective candidates from the Nominations and Elections Commit-

Items which appear to be slated for the agenda at this time include bylaws changes, a rehabilitation loan for the larger homes, disposition of the freestanding and the attached boiler rooms, and a petition suggesting reduction in the size of the board of directors. The board received a list of proposed "editorial changes" in the bylaws. A list of "substantive" changes will be made available later. Discussion of both types will be scheduled at a later meeting.

Proposals for utilizing the small, attached boiler rooms were discussed by the board at the meeting. A plan for an efficiency apartment prepared by Grimm and Parker Architects showed how a typical boiler room could be converted to living space for a single individual. The board also discussed the possibility of converting unsold boiler rooms to storage spaces to be rented to occupants of the court.

A new factor in the discussion of uses of the freestanding boiler rooms was introduced by a bid to demolish all four large boiler rooms at a fraction of the price which management had estimated demolition would cost. In discussing other options for using the large boiler rooms, President Margaret Hogensen pointed out that some of the proposed uses would not recoup the costs involved. For instance, a community center would not only not pay for itself, it might represent a These options will be presented to the membership on May 22 for decision. Director Ray McCawley suggested that one or more information meetings for members be set up before that date.

The board attempted to adopt regulations covering fireplaces and stoves and their chimneys but bogged down in unanswered questions and ambiguous language. After an hour's discussion, the subject was returned to management for redrafting.

The board voted unanimously

to pay \$1000 dues for GHI to remain a supporting member for the Co-operative League of the USA. The board also supported without dissent a motion to donate \$50 to the Prince Georges County Beautification Committee, which plays a large role in the county's tree program.

Insurance Rates

The bad news for the evening was a whopping 50% increase in insurance premiums for a package of insurance which last year had cost slightly less than \$100,000. According to General Manager Ron Colton, the increase is due to the "turmoil" in the insurance industry and the losses which it has sustained. Another factor, he said, is the drop in

CFG Meeting to Discuss City Bond Referendum

"The ABCs of the 1985 Bond Referendum" will be the theme of the annual meeting and election of officers of Citizens for Greenbelt, Inc., at 8 p.m., March 21, at the city council chambers in the Municipal Building.

The proposed six-million dollar bond issue for city capital improvements targets three areas for consideration: buildings, such as a new police station and rerevation of North End School; construction of an indoor swimming pool or improvement of the present outdoor pool; and park improvements and land acquisitions. A vote on the bond referendum is scheduled for this spring.

Norton Bonaparte, a consultant from the University of Maryland's Institute of Governmental Services, will discuss the uses of bonds for capital improvements. Mayor Gil Weidenfeld and Councliman Thomas White will follow with the city's bond issue.





interest rates, which have reduced the companies' interest income-a reduction which must be made up in premiums. GHI had mailed bid packages to seven brokers but received a bid from only one, the company which carried the insurance last year. With virtually no other option, the board voted unanimously to renew the insurance contract with Horenberg Insurance Services.

Colton also presented information on a new telephone system for emergency calls. The new system, which involves calling two recorded message numbers before a real, live person returns the call, did not meet with complete approval by the board but was considered better than the previous system, which involved an answering service. The new system went into effect on March 1.



Baby (deciduous) teeth serve several important functions. Besides their basic role in chewing, baby teeth aid in proper speech, give form to the face, and most important, hold the space for the permanent teeth which will eventually replace them.

Although permanent teeth begin forming even before birth, some are not ready to erupt into the mouth until age 12 or 13. If one or more of the baby teeth are prematurely lost or even just badly decayed, these permanent teeth may come in crooked or be prevented from erupting at all due to loss of adequate space.




