GHI Receives Member Petition, Considers Parking Problems

The GHI board, at its regular Thursday evening meeting on July 16, dealt with a wide-ranging agenda including alternative physical layouts for court parking, consideration of the credentials of a possible mortgage lender, and even the question of what level of computer system would be suitable for the needs of the staff at Hamilton Place. All of these matters took some time just for orientation, extending the meeting till well past midnight.

At the beginning of the meeting, a petition signed by 80 members was presented by Ruth Myers to the board, asking for better maintenance performance on routine upkeep of gutters, grounds, sidewalks and painting. Myers suggested this was an appropriate subject for the Audit Committee to consider. The petition itself suggested that "computerization" of maintenance

(discussed later in the meeting) was less important than the quality of maintenance itself. Manager Ron Colton asked the Audit Committee to furnish some specific instances for the staff's information.

Parking

Several items under this heading were prepared and presented by the staff for board action. To start with, the general parking regulations themselves, which form Section 14 of GHI's Rules and Regulations, have been slightly amended to be more precise with regard to designation of GHI parking spaces in the North End and to distinguish between rental and member-owned garages. This received board approval. Three proposed court parking improvements were then put before the board; two of these, at 52-54 Ridge Road and at 59-61 Ridge Road, did not pose any particular problems. Of four options submitted to the residents of 52-54 Court Ridge, Option D - adding three spaces to the present lot, and also using single-car parking tags - was acceptable

to a majority. The board accordingly approved the creation of the three spaces, to be included in Phase I construction this summer. In the case of 59-61 Court Ridge, a meeting was held in late June at which the residents supported the one-space-per-unit principle but opposed converting the four head-in spaces at 59 Ridge to two parallel spaces. The staff therefore proposed that this conversion be dropped, together with the idea of parking space construction opposite 61 Court Ridge. The present four head-in spaces can be relined for five cars, which will suffice until the city undertakes reconstruction of this part of Ridge Road. The board approved this solution also.

In the case of 2 Court Gardenway, a somewhat more complicated situation was encountered. Several members of the Court attended the meeting to express their preferences for one of two proposed schemes to provide ten additional parking spaces in the

City Opposes Extension Of Kenilworth Avenue

Surprised at reading in *The Prince Georges Journal* that Prince Georges County had advanced the extension of Kenilworth Avenue from an inactive status to the second highest county road priority, the Greenbelt City Council has reacted swiftly. In letters to County Executive Parris Glendening and the county council, Mayor Gil Weidenfeld, speaking for the city council, urged reconsideration of priorities.

Greenbelt takes the position that "the Kenilworth Avenue project, in effect, will extend the inter-county connector to Greenbelt. That highway's eastern terminus was planned to be U.S. One."

"Greenbelt already has more than its share of intersections, with I-95-Capital Beltway, Baltimore - Washington Parkway, Greenbelt Road and existing Kenilworth Avenue all criss-crossing within a mile," said Weidenfeld.

Noting that this proposal has been made without consulting Greenbelt, the city council is seeking action by the Prince Georges County council either to delete or defer this project from the priority listing.

Bram, Chernikoff File For City Council Election

Two more candidates have filed their nomination petitions to run for seats on the Greenbelt City Council - incumbent Antoinette M. (Toni) Bram and challenger Keith Chernikoff. Bram is completing her second term on the city council, this is Chernikoff's first try for a city elective office. Gil Weidenfeld, Joseph Isaacs, Irene Hensel and Thomas X. White have already announced their candidacies.

Bram Biography

Antoinette M. Bram was first elected to City Council in 1983, and re-elected in 1985.

Long a civic activist, Bram has lived in Greenbelt for 27 years. She was a five-year resident of Plateau Place before her move with husband Ralph, and four children to Tamarisk Court. One of her first activities as a Boxwood resident was to organize a group which petitioned City Council to construct the bike path/walkway along Crescent Road from Lastner Lane to Northway. Bram was also part of the group which met in protest to the appointment of a local developer to the position of the Governor's liaison to local governments.

In June, she completed the requirements for a Master of Arts Degree in History at the University of Maryland. The degree will be awarded on August 25. In 1981, she was awarded a Bachelor of Science Degree, Summa Cum Laude, from the University of Maryland, majoring in urban studies.

Bram has served on the city's Advisory Planning Board, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, and has held leadership positions with the Greenbelt Aquatic Boosters Club, the Greenbelt Homemakers Club, and St. Hugh's C.Y.O. She has been a coach in the Greenbelt Boys and Girls Club, and a leader in the Greenbelt Campfire Girls.

As a Greenbelt city council member, she has been a committee member of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments, the Maryland Municipal League, and the National League of Cities.

Bram organized and was elected first president of the Prince Georges County Elected Municipal Women. She is a non-voting member of the Board of Directors, Friends of the Greenbelt Museum.

Bram works as Associate Registrar, University College, University of Maryland. She is a native of Washington, D.C. and a 1953 graduate of Notre Dame Academy.

Chernikoff Biography

Keith Chernikoff is a senior business applications analyst at Arbitron. He has been employed there for seven years in a variety of capacities in production and software development.

Before moving to Greenbelt Chernikoff lived in Seabrook, Md. He is a graduate of DuVal High School and the University of Maryland. During the late 1970's he chaired the Seabrook Civic Association Land-Use Subcommittee. Concurrently he was appointed twice to the Governor's Youth Advisory Council and was a member of its executive committee. He served on the Seabrook Recreation Board as vice-president (1979-80) and as president (1981-82).

He lived in Lakeside North Apartments before moving to the 4 Court Crescent Road in 1985. He recently was elected as a member of Greenbelt Homes Incorporated (GHI) Nominations and Elections Committee. Since 1984, he has been chairperson for the Greenbelt Park and Recreation Board (PRAB).

Chernikoff is past president and vice-president of Citizens for Greenbelt. As a five-year member of the Eleanor and Franklin Roosevelt Democratic Club, he has served in a variety of offices. He was a member of the Citizens for the Bond Issue in 1985. In 1986, he helped found and organize the Citizens for North End Center (CNEC) whose goal is the conversion of North End School into a multi-purpose, multi-generational activity center. He is a member of Greenbelt Consumer Co-op, Friends of the Greenbelt Museum, and the Greenbelt Tennis Association.

Now is the Time . . .

During the next two years, the Greenbelt City Council will be overseeing construction of the new police station and indoor pool; renovation of the North End School and the outdoor pool; parkland acquisition and development; and other projects to be funded by bond issue proceeds. Council will also have to deal with the problems of a growing city and the impact of nearby development.

On September 15, citizens of Greenbelt will have the opportunity to elect the people who will be making these decisions. We urge all residents of Greenbelt to take part in this process. Past elections have featured many opportunities for citizens and candidates to meet and exchange views, so that voters may make an informed choice when they vote.

But the first step of the process for each voter is to register. Registration with the county Board of Elections does NOT make you eligible to vote in the city elections. If you have not voted in at least one of the past two city council elections, you must register with the city clerk by August 17 in order to be eligible to vote this year. You may register by mail using the form elsewhere in this week's paper, or you can register in person at any of several registration sites listed in the city's ad.

Take part in the city's future. Register to vote in September.




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

WOMAN WALKING HOME IS SEXUALLY ASSAULTED

A 20-year-old woman, walking back to her apartment in the 6000 block of Springhill Drive after having visited a nearby convenience store, was sexually attacked about 11 p.m., Sunday evening, July 26 by a man who threatened her with a knife and forced her to go with him to a secluded area behind the Springhill Lake Elementary School where he forced her to perform an unnatural sex act with him. He told her, "I would have sex with you, but I don't want any diseases." Then he thanked her and left in an unknown direction.

The suspect is pictured above in a composite identification sketch. He was white, about 20 to 23 years of age, 5'10" to 6', thin build, with brown hair, brown eyes, brown mustache, wearing a white tank top T-shirt and faded blue jeans. Loud and Clear

To the Editor:

Do the citizens of Greenbelt want an extension of Kenilworth Avenue, a four-lane highway, through Beltsville, where the charming and rural two-lane Edmonston Road is now located?

If not, we had better let our state representatives know right away, because the County Council has just approved this project over the unanimous expressed opposition of our City Council.

At last Monday's City Council meeting, each and every member expressed profound dismay over the way County Executive Paris Glendening has "railroaded" this proposal through without adequate notice to any of the parties involved, least of all our City Council. Council member Joe Isaacs called it "a slap in the face." Mayor Gil Weidenfeld noted that the combination of the Kenilworth extension with the proposed extension of the Inter-county Connector to Route 301 is a "double-barreled approach" that would in effect "make the Outer Beltway come through Greenbelt."

County politicians in league with area developers are deftly trying to persuade us that these wonderful new roads will relieve future traffic congestion resulting from all the wonderful new development. However, as City Manager James Giese has correctly pointed out, "New roads only open new areas for development." There has to be a limit somewhere, and Greenbelt citizens are going to have to tell these people where it is.

Please join me in supporting the valiant (but so far apparently disregarded) efforts of our City Council and staff to oppose the unnecessary and unwarranted Kenilworth Avenue extension. If we don't make our opposition loud and clear and immediate, we can count on a major new highway next door to the formerly peaceful Beltsville Farm, along with the attendant noise, pollution, congestion and further development. Swim Program

To the Editor:

I would like to clear up any misunderstanding that might have resulted from a letter in last week's News Review sent in by Elizabeth Pels.

First of all, the Aquatic Boosters Club is simply a volunteer

parent board set up years ago to help the Recreation Department with the demanding job of organizing and running a swim team and swim meets. This board of swim team parents fills the 35 volunteer jobs it takes to run a swim meet each week. This frees the Recreation Department to run the rest of their excellent swimming programs.

Secondly, swimming lessons and community water activities have not been left behind. The Recreation Department runs an extensive program including water-babies through senior lifesaving Tues.-Fri., 9 a.m.-12:20 p.m. for eight weeks every summer. In addition, there is a Senior Citizen swim on Mondays from 10 a.m.-12 p.m. and daily adult lap swimming from 7 a.m.-8 a.m. and 12 p.m.-1 p.m. There are four to eight splash parties each summer month in the evenings after the pool closes. These are for teenagers, local groups and organizations. This certainly provides swimming activities and experiences for "youngsters (and others) who are not interested in or not able to participate in the competitive sport."


The swim team uses the pool from 6 a.m.-9 a.m. before it opens for lessons. From 7 a.m.-8 a.m. we share it with adults doing lap swimming. The swim team is only a small part of the many water activities offered in Greenbelt. We work hard during our season to make swimming fun for the kids. For most swimmers, our season ended July 25. The Recreation Department lessons and community swimming programs continue through August 21. These activities are certainly not being left behind. Special activities continue through Labor Day Weekend.

court, which presently has 33 garages. Scheme A takes up some of the common green space but allows for a buffer strip along the entrance driveway, without cars backing into the driveway. while Scheme B preserves more green area though impinging on the driveway. Advocates of Scheme B preferred saving the common area, while advocates of Scheme A argued for safety; there were also internal preferences depending on which side of the court a resident lived on. In the ensuing discussion two compromise Schemes C and D were developed by board members, and manager Colton agreed to poll the court on all four options.

The attached boiler rooms in some courts, presently unused, will be converted to storage space for rental by members as authorized at the Annual Meeting. An end unit addition was approved at 3-H Laurel Hill Road, adjacent to the North End townhomes, for a member couple who stated "We like being in Greenbelt and GHI, and want to stay"; The staff promised cooperation with a member on matters of drainage for her garden and timing of maintenance repairs with her kitchen renovation. Last but certainly not least for Andrea Haslinger, a request from the Labor Day Festival beauty pageant was turned down because of Haslinger's objection "to the idea of beauty pageants;" the board instead donated \$100 to the general Festival Committee.



What causes cold sores?

Treatment of the cold sores consists of lessening the discomfort. Many over the counter medicines are available which offer limited relief, but by far the best advice is to avoid salt and spicy foods which tend to further irritate the area and prolong healing.






