## Council Adopts Personnel Policies On Sick Leave and Shift Rotation

After many months of meeting in a room crowded with debris from carpentry and duct work, sometimes with dust cloths strewn across furniture and access to seating blocked by beams or tables tipped on end, members of the Greenbelt City Council took their places Monday night in a council chamber that looked finished and with all furniture in its proper place. Behind the council members was a wall painted a soft shade of blue which picked up a color in the muted print of draperies hung the entire length of the two side walls. Varnished woodwork glowed. Possibly the room's ambience had something to do with the lack of contentiousness in the way the members went about their business. All was over by 9:30—almost a record.

### Sick Leave Policy

Two issues introduced by Police Chief James R. Craze were the major items of business. At his request council adopted a new personnel policy currently applicable to only one member of the Police Department but with potentially wider relevance. This action authorizes the establishment of a sick leave pool into which employees could allocate some of their own sick leave to be used by others whose sick leave had run out.

The issue arose over the case of Officer Thomas Moreland, who suffered extensive burn injuries from an accident while he was on vacation. While Officer Moreland receives temporary disability benefits from the city, these have been supplemented until now by other benefits arising from his own accrued sick leave. Without that supplement, Craze said, Moreland would face a substantial reduction in benefits. Currently he is expected to be ready to return to full employment by September—possibly earlier if he can be assigned to light work.

Since policies of donated sick leave apply in other jurisdictions in the area, Assistant Personnel Officer Barbara Havekost had explored for the city how these might work. Following her inquiry, City Manager James Giese recommended certain limiting regulations to the donation of such leave: (1) that approval be given only on a case-by-case basis, currently affecting only Officer Moreland; (2) that donations be permitted only from employees with accrued leave in excess of 176 hours (the equivalent of 22 days or one calendar month); (3) that donations be made in increments of eight hours, with the maximum by one employee limited to 40 hours

(five days); (4) that donations full 80 hours in each biweekly pay period; and (5) that if donations exceed the amount of sick leave required, these be re-credited to each employee on a pro rata basis.

In the course of discussion council member Antoinette Bram questioned why the 176-hour limit was felt to be necessary. In answer Giese indicated that employees needed to build up a minimum amount of sick leave to protect themselves, the amount required before disability benefits kicked in.

### New Police Shift Schedule

Because of the detrimental physical and psychological effects of rotating shifts, which interfere with the human diurnal clock, Chief Craze said that he has consulted with several experts about ways to improve the shift schedule to better meet employee needs. Following their recommendation he and Giese advocated the adoption of a new policy, called "The Triangle Plan." According to this schedule, officers would work a combination of daytime and evening hours over a 24-week period, followed by a period of days off and then an 8-week sequence of midnight shifts. Instead of an 8-hour workday, officers would work an 8.5-hour workday, providing an overlap of on-duty officers during a shift change.

Although this schedule results in an irregular number of hours worked during a pay period, varying from 68 to 85 hours, it complies with the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act Regulations so as to avoid the payment of overtime. In a 52-week period, total hours worked would amount to 2065 hours, instead of the standard 2080. Giese recommended that no effort be made to adjust compensation for the shortfall of 15 hours during a 52-week work year.

The new schedule would result in some fluctuation in number of hours worked in any two-week pay period; nevertheless, because of accounting problems that would confront the city in trying to deal with these fluctuations, Giese recommended that biweekly pay be rendered on the basis of 80 hours of regular time pay. He noted that these changes would only apply to officers working the triangle rotating shift schedule. Other officers would be expected to work a

## Gypsy Moth Spraying

The city of Greenbelt is planning an aerial spraying of about 85 acres this spring as part of this year's gypsy moth suppression program. The blocks to be sprayed include about eight different areas in the central city and Greenbelt East.

Areas to be sprayed by the city this year include the woods behind the Lutheran Church on Greenbelt Road; the woods adjacent to the Greenbelt Armory; Indian Springs Park; the woods adjacent to the Public Works and Police facilities; Greenbriar Park; the school board property on Mandan Road across from Greenbriar Park; the strip of woods behind homes on Matthew Street; and a portion of Schrom Hill's Park. These areas will be sprayed with Dimilin, which is a highly effective gypsy moth caterpillar suppressant.

For the last three years, the city has hired a consultant, Espro, Inc., to perform counts of egg masses throughout the city. This year's counts showed much smaller populations than the previous two years. This is due in part to the City's suppression program of the last two years and in part to the fact that egg mass counts are down naturally

## New Crossing Signal Now Operating at ERHS



throughout the region.

The 85 acres to be sprayed this year are about one-fifth the area which the City contracted to spray last year. Unlike last year, the Maryland Department of Agriculture will not be conducting any aerial spraying in Greenbelt this year, although the Beltsville Agricultural Research Center will be sprayed.

The city also plans to continue selling gypsy moth caterpillar tape at cost to residents. The small investment of a roll of tape can protect individual trees in a homeowner's yard. Because the city had problems with the brand of tape used last year (many residents complained that the tape did not stick to trees) the city is exploring alternative brands of tape to sell this year.

### Mapping Lunar Surface And Other Observations

On Sunday, March 24, 1 p.m. at the Goddard Visitor Center Dr. Jack Trombka, of Goddard's Laboratory for Astronomy and Solar Physics, will discuss how the crews of the Apollo 15 and 16 spacecraft mapped the lunar surface. They also took observations of the energy distribution of both gamma-rays and x-rays emitted from the moon, super hot stars, collapsed stars, black holes, and magnetic fields between the stars. Similar, but more sophisticated, instruments are expected to be launched April 1991 onboard the Gamma Ray Observatory, the heaviest NASA spacecraft ever to be deployed from the shuttle.

# GEAC Meeting Offers Full Details On Participating in PG Recycling

Recycling is coming to the townhouses in Greenbelt East, as well as to the city's trash customers, starting in the middle of April. Marcelino Cole, residential recycling specialist from the Prince Georges County Office of Recycling, brought the news to the March 7 meeting of the Greenbelt East Advisory Coalition (GEAC). Cole will be in touch with all of the city's townhouse communities that do not have city trash pickup so that curbside pick-up points can be decided on.

Earlier plans had included only city trash customers in the county recycling program until the county's Materials Recycling Facility (MRF) was constructed, which will take at least until 1992. The county has decided, however, that the temporary MRF in Capital Heights can handle the load. Currently, 35,000 households are recycled. Picking up Greenbelt's recyclables will add 14,000 households, with another 125,000 to go. The county's plan is to add all of the municipalities to the program (except Eagle Harbor, because of the distance involved) as temporary MRF's can be established and bring the rest of the county on board when the "Major MRF" is ready.

Materials for recycling will be picked up once a week. The contractor will divide the city into two zones and pick up in each zone alternately on either Tuesday or Thursday. Although the county tries to coincide with trash collection days, this may not always be possible since recycle collection zones will not be identical with regular trash collection zones and schedules.

#### Curbside Pick-up

Cole's major area of concern in meeting with GEAC was curbside pickup. While trash collection in some communities is done at the rear of each unit, recycling pickup must be at curbside (except in GHI, which is a separate issue). Since some townhouse units do not have a curb, Cole will be talking with

the individual communities to work out places for residents to put out their recyclable materials.

Curbside locations for curbside units include reserved parking spaces, such as in Windsor Green or Greenbrook Village, alongside the container of a unit with curbs or at a nearby corner.

Each household will also receive a postcard announcing details of the program and giving the county telephone number to call with questions, complaints or compliments about the contractor or requests for replacement containers. Cole's number is 925-5963.

#### Ora Glen Light Update

James Foy, GEAC Chair, reported on the action taken by council at the February 25 meeting, when council voted 5-0 to proceed with the installation of the traffic light at Hanover Parkway and Ora Glen Drive/Hanover Park Drive. City staff's 5-day traffic count of the traffic generated by Commerce Center III at 80 percent occupancy showed more than 220 trips. Commerce is required to pay for installation of the light if it generated more than 170 trips at 90 percent occupancy, which it clearly does.

The light will have a protected left-turn lane from southbound Hanover Parkway to Ora Glen. It will be sensed so that Hanover Parkway traffic will only get a red signal if there is cross traffic. Also, a pedestrian button will give a longer red light, but not a red on demand.

Current time estimates are four weeks for engineering design of the left-turn lane addition, four weeks for the bid

process, and six to ten weeks for construction. The light should be in operation in mid to late July.

#### School Zone Speed Limit

Foy, Ed Schilling of Windsor Green and Councilmember Ed Putens all urged GEAC members to call, fax and write to state delegates asking for their support of House Bill 605, which would allow municipalities to lower the speed limit on state highways in school zones. This could be a way to lower the speed limit on Greenbelt Road in front of Eleanor Roosevelt High School. The bill, in the Judiciary Committee, said Putens, could die in committee and never reach the floor of the House unless citizen support is shown.


#### Trees

# Willis M. Gault

Willis M. Gault, 82, a Greenbelt violin maker who was also a musician, died March 13 at the Greenbelt Nursing Home where he had been a patient for the past year.

He began making violins and teaching others the art in an area of Washington, D.C. called the "old music quarter" which has disappeared to make way for high-rise office buildings. For 27 years, he made instruments for such diverse musicians as members of the Budapest String Quartet and Supreme Court Justice Abe Fortas. Unlike most violin makers, who passed their craft on to others individually, Gault ran a school where music students and musicians learned how to make instruments for their own use and who, in many cases, became instrument makers with country-wide reputations. Among these students was Gary Sturm, now collections manager of bowed stringed instruments at the Smithsonian Institution. Sturm observed in the recent Washington Post obituary feature article that Gault "nurtured in students a real love for what they were doing."

Born in Showell on Maryland's Eastern Shore, he taught himself to play the violin before he was nine years old and at that age made his own violin. As a teenager, he apprenticed with a Washington violin maker. He worked for 13 years as an accounting clerk for the Treasury Department before opening his violin shop. His fascination with ancient music led him to co-found the Ancient Instrument Society of Washington. His enthusiasm was directed especially toward reviving interest in the viola d'amore, a 14-string instrument popular during the 1500's and 1600's. He made 160 instruments modeled after those used in earlier centuries.

Gault founded several string ensembles, he composed four works for viola d'amore and orchestra, some of which were recorded here, and he played with the Prince Georges County Civic Symphony and the Montgomery County Svmphony.

Survivors include his wife,

Katherine Gault of Oxon Hill; a son, James, of La Plata; two grandchildren and a great-grandson.

Graveside services were held on March 16 at Odd Fellow Cemetery in Bishopville, but a memorial service is planned for 1 p.m. this Saturday, March 23, at the Mowatt Memorial United Methodist Church in Greenbelt. Memorial contributions may be sent to the church music fund.

## Mileski Resigns from GHI Board

Ken Mileski, member of the Board of Directors of Greenbelt Homes Inc., submitted his resignation at the board meeting held on March 14. Mileski will be leaving Greenbelt to return to Wisconsin where his family resides. A new board member will be appointed to fill the vacancy until the annual meeting in May.

**Sublease Request**  
GHI members Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Bernheisel were present to respond to questions regarding their request to sublease their home for 27 months, longer than the period usually approved by the board. Bernheisel's parents are applying for the Peace Corps and have requested the younger Bernheisels to house sit. The board granted approval for this exception to the regulations.

**Shed Regulations**  
At its last meeting, the board voted to revise the GHI Rules and Regulations to prohibit erection of any new metal sheds. A discussion of the proposed new shed regulations was slated for this meeting. The topic was tabled, however, to review the issue of metal sheds.

**Replacement Windows**  
Since the closeout of the rehab program in 1984, GHI staff have been authorized to contract for replacement of windows that, for various reasons, were not replaced during rehab. Although members were able to finance this work through the rehab loan, they were required to pay any unpaid amount at the time they sold their unit. Conversely, loan payments for the official rehab work can be passed on by selling members to purchasers. The board has now revised its policy so that selling members who purchased replacement windows after the rehab program will not be required to repay the loan upon resale or transfer of the

**Replacement Glass**  
After soliciting bids, GHI approved entering into a contract with Beltway Window Systems to measure and install replacement window glass for GHI members. Currently members are responsible for paying for all glass breakage. Under this contract, interested members will contact GHI staff who will ar-

range for the glass replacement. GHI will pay the contractor and, then, bill the member. The question of whether members should pay for breakage that is not their fault (the current regulation) was brought up. The board agreed to address this issue during 1992 budget discussions.

### Block Home Siding

At its last meeting, the board reviewed cost estimates for installing insulation and vinyl siding on the block homes. An estimate for a middle unit is approximately \$3,700 or about \$42 per month. Staff was requested to prepare a letter to ascertain how many of the 256 members living in block units would be interested in siding.




