Public Forum Saturday on Master Plan

The Prince Georges County Planning Board will hold draft amendment of the 19 a public forum on the Board's draft amendment of the 1970 College Park-Greenbelt Master Plan. The forum is scheduled for Thursday, March 3 at 7:30 p.m. in the University of Maryland Adult Education Center Auditorium, University Boulevard at Adelphi Road. Also to be considered are the 1963 Takoma Park-Langley Park Plan (excluding Takoma Park) and the 1965 Hillandale Plan. Public input is encouraged.

The area covered by the draft plan amendment is about 27.8 square miles. It runs from the Montgomery County border on the west to Cipriano Road and the Goddard Space Flight Center on the east. The District of Columbia line, Calvert Road, and Good Luck Road mark most of its southern limit, while Powder Mill Road represents about half of its northern limit. In addition to Greenbelt, the municipalities of University Park, College Park, and Berwyn Heights are in the planning area, as are the University of Maryland and much of the Beltsville Agricultural Research Center and the Goddard Space Flight Center.

The greater part of current land use (44.3%) is public and quasi-public because of these three large institutions. Rights-of-way and vacant land account for 14.1% and 12.7% respectively. Residential, 25.6%, commercial, 2.5%, and industrial, 0.8%, are the other uses. Although not true in Greenbelt, single-family detached homes account for about two-thirds of the residential land use in the entire planning area. Parks make up almost one-third of the public use acreage.

Residential use accounts for more than 80% of the acreage that is zoned. The figure is somewhat misleading, however, in that schools, parks and other public uses exist on residentially-zoned land. As a matter of fact, about 55% of residentially-zoned land is in public and quasi-public use.

In the planning area there was a small population decline of 1,825 people between 1970 and 1980. Population in the recent census was 108,641. The number of housing units increased, however, from 34,741 in 1970 to 42,223 in 1980, or by 21.5%. The nationwide trend toward smaller families is reflected in these numbers.

Highways are the means by which most people and goods are moved in the planning area. Major roads vary in condition from good, through acceptable and marginal, to poor. In the immediate area of Greenbelt, the planners rate the Baltimore-Washington Parkway as being in poor operating condition, Cipriano Road as acceptable, Good Luck

Road as acceptable to marginal, Greenbelt/Glendale Road as marginal to poor, and Kenilworth Avenue as acceptable to poor.

— Proportion of multifamily housing that exceeds the county average. Much undeveloped land is zoned for multifamily development. Less dense use of these parcels is a subject for study.

Property development and appropriate density/intensity as related to adequacy of access to highways and their capacity to serve new users. Some areas where adequacy of access requires study are the employment area south of Greenbelt Road and along east side of the B & O Railroad, the employment area south of Greenbelt Road and west of the B & O Railroad, and the proposed Greenbelt Metro station.

— Whether the proposed Perimeter Road should remain in the Master Plan. As projected, it would follow Mandan Road across the Baltimore-Washington Parkway to Ridge Road near Lastner Lane, then over Kenilworth and the Beltway to Cherrywood Lane.

— Areas, including Greenbelt Road, which involve a multiplicity of curb cuts, conflicting traffic flows, inadequate parking, lack of landscaping, uncoordinated signs, etc.

Among highway improvements being considered in connection with the Metro E Line, which is scheduled to terminate in Greenbelt, are ramps from the Beltway to the Greenbelt Metro Station that will be located just inside the Beltway, and extension of Cherrywood Lane over the Beltway to Ivy Lane.

The planning staff has identified many major planning issues and opportunities as bases for analysis. These will eventually result in recommendations for future development of the area. Citizen input at the forum and in other ways is expected to expand the list. Those already identified include:

— Future commercial growth. If any is needed, how much and where?

— Revitalization of some commercial areas. The Greenbelt Center was analyzed recently.

— Possible office or mixed-use development at the proposed Greenbelt Metro station.

— Future industrial growth. If any is needed, how much and where?

Many public facility improvement projects have been included in state and county plans. For obvious reasons they relate to land use.

These include:

— Widening Greenbelt Road from the Baltimore-Washington Parkway to Mandan Road (completion, June 1985),

— Extension of Hanover Parkway to Good Luck Road (completion, June 1985),

— Hanover Parkway storm drainage facilities (completion, June 1983),

— Intersection of Greenbelt Road and Kenilworth Avenue (interchange construction to begin by July 1984),

— Baltimore - Washington Parkway between District of Columbia and Anne Arundel County line, planning study,

— Reconstruction of Greenbelt Road between Kenilworth Avenue and Baltimore-Washington Parkway,

— Reconstruction of Greenbelt Road between Baltimore-Washington Parkway and Good Luck Road,

— Construction of part of Greenbelt/Perimeter Road.

The purse snatchings reported last week were solved this week when three suspects were arrested by Pfc. David R. Kress, who gave chase to the suspects' vehicle after receiving a look-out from Prince Georges County police in connection with a strong-arm robbery which occurred outside the city. The public hearing will be conducted as the first item of business on the agenda of the regular meeting of City Council.

At the public hearing, all citizens of Greenbelt, Maryland shall have an opportunity to provide written and oral comments on the possible uses of Revenue Sharing Fund monies, as well as on the uses of all other funds to be budgeted. Senior citizens and organizations representing the interests of senior citizens will be given every opportunity to be heard and to present their views regarding the allocation of these funds prior to final allocation.


The following amounts are estimated to be available for allocation in the Revenue Sharing Fund during the coming fiscal year:

Legislation authorizing the Federal Revenue Sharing Program expires at the end of the current Federal Fiscal Year, September 30, 1983. Thus, at present the City is only assured of one quarterly payment in Fiscal Year 1984. If the program is re-enacted by Congress, the City could receive additional entitlement funds. At the current rate of receipt, these additional funds would be approximately \$63,250.

After the public hearing, the City Manager will prepare his budget proposal for Revenue Sharing Funds and all other City funds for submission to the City Council on April 4, 1983. Subsequently, the City Council will conduct a public hearing on the revenue sharing budget and all other City budgets prior to adoption of the FY 1983/84 budget.

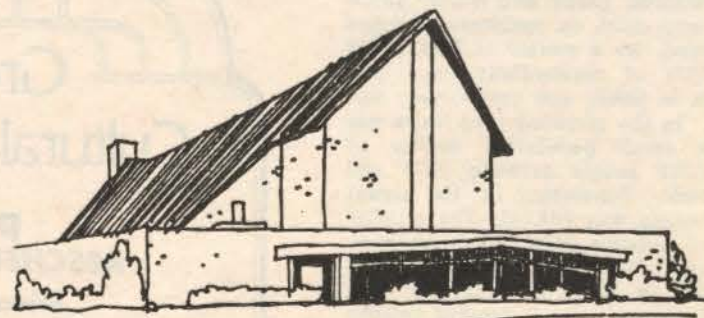
