County "Festival of Flight" Offers Balloon Rides, Contests, Fireworks

It all began in a field near Bladensburg on Jure 17, 1784. On that date a young attorney named Peter Carnes made the first successful hot air balloon ascension in the Western Hemisphere. In the 202 years after that historic event, much of the history of American aviation has continued to take place in Prince Georges County.

In celebration of the numerous aviation milestones which are part of the county's history, the Prince Georges Travel Promotion Council and the Coca Cola Bottling Company are sponsoring a "Festival of Flight" on June 14 and 15 at the historic College Park airport. The festival will feature aeronautical exhibits, model airplanes and model rocketry, antique aircraft displays, historical films on aviation and lectures by aviation authorities. There will also be corporate blimp fly-overs, hot-air balloon rides, musical entertainment and fireworks displays.

Dr. Ronald Parise, Astro Payload Specialist for the Computer Sciences Corporation, is the Honorary Chairman of the event, Dr. Parise will join with County Executive Parris Glendening for the official opening ceremonies at noon, Saturday, June 14 at College Park Airport.

Baseball Hall of Famer Brooks Robinson will be on hand to sign autographs from 2 to 4 p.m. on Sunday, June 15.,

More than twenty hot air balloons will be at the airport over the weekend to give tethered rides starting at 5:30 p.m. on Saturday and at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday.

At 9 p.m. a fireworks display will conclude the day's activities at the airport Saturday evening.

Plogman to Run For School Board

Suzanne Plogman, a Greenbelt Advisory Planning Board member and former chairperson of the county's commission for women, filed on Tuesday to run for the Prince Georges County School Board's second district seat. She is the first to file for the position currently held by Lesley Kreimer.

A county school teacher for the last eight years, Plogman will remain on leave during the campaign from her special education position at Northwestern High School. While on leave, Plogman has been serving on the county committee monitoring the magnet schools program.

In the 1984 presidential primary, she ran on the Mondale ticket as a candidate for Democratic national convention delegate. She is a vice president of Eleanor and Franklin Roosevelt Democratic Club and a member of the Greenbelt Democratic Coordinating Committee, She is also on the Family Crisis Center's board of directors and is a former secretary of the Greenbelt Arts Center's board of directors. Elected last year to the Greenbelt Homes. Inc. (GHI) Nomination and Elections Committee, she also handled the public relations for the Save Our Services Campaign and was a committee member of the Citizens for the Bond Referendum in May, 1985.

Greenbelt city council member Joseph Isaacs is her campaign treasurer, and Susan Robbins, a former aide to county executive Parris Glendening and a Glen Ora resident, is the campaign's chairperson.

The candidate is 32 years old, married and has a six-month-old son. She has lived for nearly six years in Greenbelt, in a GHI house on 2 Court Northway, with her husband. Rennie Mihalovic. Before moving to Greenbelt, Plogman and her husband lived in Seabrook for two years. She grew up in Pikesville, a Baltimore suburb. She received her bachelor's degree in special education from Hood College, Frederick and her Master's Degree from the University of Arizona, Tucson.

New Police Station Is to Be On Parcel 8, Council Says

The Greenbelt City Council unanimously selected Parcel 8 as the site for the city's new police facility at its May 5 regular meeting. Located between Ridge and Crescent Rds. and Kenilworth Ave., Parcel 8 was recommended by the city staff because of its central location and size and because it can be acquired for the cost of replacing the parkland.

At a work session on May 14, council met with architect Steve Parker of Grimm & Parker and with city Police Chief Frank Hutson to discuss building plans and the size of the facility.

The proposed main building requires about 18,000 square feet. An additional 2,000 square feet is needed for the sally port for prisoner entrance and for the detached two-bay garage.

Hutson said the facility is designed for 75 police personnel. There are presently 52 employees in the department, but Hutson projects an increase in staff of about 25 in the next 10 years.

Although 52 people will not be in the building at one time, Hutson said separate areas are necessary for male and female priscners as well as for minors and adults. Prisoners under the influence of PCP also need to be kept separate, Hutson said.

Currently, there is only one holding cell in the police station in the municipal building. Some prisoners must be handcuffed to

Council member Joseph Isaacs told Hutson, "I won't presume to tell you what should go in the police facility, My concern is the view of the facility from Hedgewood Drive."



Council member Edward Putens wanted justification for every square foot of space requested before he would approve any specific design.

Mayor Gil Weidenfeld summed up council's responsibility by saying, "We shouldn't decide the floor plan, but we need to be convinced all the requested space is necessary."







State Fire Marshal Warns Against Illegal Fireworks

Maryland State Fire Marshal Rocco J. Gabriele has announced a crackdown on the possession and use of illegal fireworks. As the Fourth of July approaches, Gabriele advises citizens that fireworks are illegal in Maryland. Only gold label sparklers are legal in Maryland except in Prince Georges and Montgomery Counties and the City of Balti-more, where all types of fireworks, including sparklers, are illegal.

In an effort ot stop the flow of illegal fireworks into the state, the State Fire Marshal's office. acting on the advice of the Attorney General's office, has notified several common carrier parcel delivery companies that shipping or transporting fireworks into the state of Maryland from other states or countries is illegal. 


