Proposed City Budget Cuts Some GHI Board Mulls Over Staff Positions; Raises Taxes 2c

Staffing levels, contributions to reserves and other expenditures for fiscal year 1992 will all be reduced from previously approved levels under Assistant City Manager Michael P. McLaughlin's proposed budget. Total staf-fing and expenditures will still increase over FY91. McLaughlin also proposes raising property taxes by two cents, to \$1.32 per \$100 assessed valuation. Council is currently conducting worksessions on the budget and will hold a public hearing Tuesday, May 14.

Major Charges

McLaughlin's budget includes a four percent cost of living adjustment for all employees. Many authorized staff positions will not be filled. These include three officers and one civilian for the police department, one recreation supervisor, two parks personnel for Schrom Hills Pa.k and part-time help equivalent to 10.9 full-time employees. Most of these part-timers were public works summer help. McLaughlin proposes some new hiring, including a part-time planner and staff for the indoor pool, scheduled to open this fall.

Besides the staff cuts, contributions to reserves for capital improvements and for replacement of equipment have been reduced. Although the effect of these cuts will not be felt immediately, they will affect the city's future spending plans.

The city questions whether it is receiving its fair share of the personal property tax. Casimir R. Prybyl, Director of Finance and Administrative Services, is investigating.

cil and staff would only need to perform a brief review this year to ensure that estimates and priorities were still accurate. Council then would pass the required spending and tax legislation.

It has not worked out that way. Greenbelt, like the rest of the area, has shared an economic slump, with FY91 revenues 6.2 percent below projections. City Manager James K. Giese directed department heads to cut expenditures by freezing most hiring and reducing other expenditures,

City staff now projects that FY92 revenues will total 10.2 million if council passes the property tax increase it tentatively approved last year. This is 8.9 percent less than originally projected and 7.5 percent more than current estimates of FY91 revenues. Because of the shortfall, all city department heads possible cuts. reexamined their budgets for

City residents should see a five cent increase in the credit they receive on their county property taxes for services they already pay for through city taxes. This change may be invisible to taxpayers, however, if the 20 cent property tax hike proposed by County Executive Parris Glendening is approved.

Proof of residency is a prerequisite for admission to the county schools. Parents an i guardians who are new residents of the county or who are registering a student for the first time must complete the Affidavit of Disclosure to verify their legal residence. Children entering kindergarten must be five (5) years old by January 1, 1992, and the child's birth certificate should be presented as proof of

The Maryland State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene has regulations which require immunizations against diptheria, whooping cough (for children through age 6), tetanus, polio, rubella (German—3 day measles), and rubeola (Red—10

day measles).

Transfer of Acreage

Ronald Colton, General Manager of Greenbelt Homes Inc. (GHI) presented the Board with a proposed agenda for the 1991 annual meeting at the regular Board Meeting

Robert Rashkin and nine other GHI members petitioned the Board to include a proposal on the agenda for the annual meeting to transfer 82.5 acres of GHI owned open and wooded land from a "Forest Management" agreement with the State "Environmental Easement" with the Maryland Environmental Trust. The Rashkin petition stated that the "Forest Management" agreement allows the culling of trees. An "Environmental Easement" would keep the acreage in its natural state except near dwellings.

During discussion concerning the petition on the transfer, the point was made that property taxes under the present system are minimal but that under the 'Environmental Easement," no taxes would be imposed during the first 15 years. After that time taxes would reflect the reduced value of the land because of the easement Board member Margaret Hogenson expressed concern that the National Cooperative Bank and Anchor Savings, who hold GHI financial notes, might not approve of a change from the present "For-est Management" plan.

Redistricting Forum To Be Held April 29

The Prince Georges Redistricting Commission has scheduled a public forum on Monday, April 29 at DuVal High School at 6:30 p.m. DuVal is located in Councilmanic District 4, which includes the city of Greenbelt.

The County Charter requires periodic redistricting to conform with population changes in the county.

The commission is seeking redistrict proposals from the pub-lic. Plans must be submitted by June 3. The commission will make recommendations to the City Council that has final redistricting responsibility.

After discussion, the Board concluded there was insufficient information for them to take a position. The Board decided to recommend to the membership at the annual meeting that the petition be tabled and that the Board be directed to investigate the "Environmental Easement" with a view to bringing a recommendation to the membership no later than the next annual meet-

Three door prizes will be offered to entice members to attend the annual meeting—one \$100 bond and two \$50 bonds.

Voting at the annual meeting will be held in the Municipal Building after the meeting on May 15 and during business hours on the next day, May 16.

Sublease Request

The Board rejected a member request for permission to sublease a unit at 7-E Crescent Road. A fact sheet furnished by Colton disclosed that the owners purchased their unit in 1983. Since then they had lived in it only about one year. They have already been given permission to sublease on five different occasions. Board Secretary Betty Deitch stated that "I don't want a rental community."

Nat Shinderman, Chairman of the Charles F. Schwan Memorial Committee, reported to the GHI Board about the proposed Schwan Memorial. The Board accepted the report. The next stop will be a joint effort between the Board and Greenbelt's City Council.

Colton presented the Board with a proposed revision of the Members' Handbook about maintenance responsibilities between GHI and its members. The current "Breakdown of Maintenance Responsibilities" is written in a very legalistic style. The proposal is in easily understood everyday language.

Girl Charges Sexual Abuse by Counselor

On April 16, a Prince Georges County Grand Jury indicted Paul E. Fischetti, 37, a counselor at Greenbelt CARES, charging him with child abuse, a fourth-degree sex offense, a third-degree sex offense and assault and battery. On March 29 he was notified to report to the Greenbelt Police Station. He complied with the request, was arrested and released on personal recognizance.

The charges stemmed from a complaint of clients, an 11-year-old girl and her father, who had come to the Greenbelt Police on February 26 to report an incident which occurred on December 11, 1990. The girl and her father and mother had been ordered last August by a District Court judge, as part of a divorce judgment, to seek counseling at Greenbelt CARES in order to "establish a normal . visitation schedule with the intent to develop a relationship that was in the best interest of the" child, according to the Statement of Charges prepared by Detective Pfc. Carolyn Mc-Lean of the Greenbelt Police Department Criminal Investigations Unit.

The State's Attorney's office presented the case to a grand jury of 23 citizens on Tuesday, April 16. The grand jury was charged with hearing the complaint and determining whether there is "probable cause to indict." Alexis Revis - Yeoman, spokesperson for the State's At-torney's office, told the News-Review on Tuesday, April 23. The hearing is held in secret and testimony from the defendant or his attorney is generally "not needed," said Revis-Yeoman, Fol-lowing the indictment, only the formal charges are made public.

When contacted by the News Review on Monday, the defendant's attorney, Sandy Baron of

Goldstein and Baron, College Park, stated: "I an: extremely confident, when the facts are fully presented, Mr. Fischetti will be completely and totally exonerated."

Fischetti has been placed on leave with pay from his position with the city.

A Prince Georges County law requires that criminal defendants are entitled to a speedy trial, according to Revis-Yeoman. A trial date must be scheduled within 180 days, she said-No date has been set at this Incoming Ninth Graders Must Register on May 7




The open meeting will provide the Board the benefit of public input regarding the study of busing patterns, before potential action is taken on the report at its meeting on May 9.



Bay Bridge Walk May 5



JOE'S TIPS OF THE WEEK

Hello Again! In acknowledgement of Earth Day and environmental contamination, the automotive repair business is no stranger. There is a classification known as a waste generator, which means you produce waste that can contaminate the environmental habitat. We here at the repair facility have complied to all federal gov-ernnment requirements and even went one step further to protect our community. First, our used engine oil is collected in a 1000 gallon containment tank and sent off to a re-cycler to be used for other related petroleum products. Second, our used engine anti freeze is collected and sent off to a local recycler and filtered and washed to create anti-freeze again. Third and last, but certainly not least, is the fluorocarbon contamination commonly known as freon. We recently purchased a recovery and recycle device that can capture refrigerant, store it, recycle it, and when needed, re-enter it back into air condition systems. The process is a little involved but you can understand the point. This type of device is important to employ for several reasons: the primary one is the protection of the atmosphere, and second it lets us capture refrigerant in the event that other non air-condition related repairs have to be performed, for example, most major engine repairs require good accessibility to the affected component. This requires complete air-condition disassembly and the discharge of refrigerant. So this eliminates this problem of discharging the system into the air. I think this system will be effective not only in the long run but in the immediate days to come. As far as engine exhaust emission is concerned, we all have been participating in the State Emission Inspection Program for some time now. Every year the standards change, requiring a low emission of exhaust levels. Here we also are concerned how clean of a burn and the actual levels of hydro-carbons that are produced. We employ a 4 gas BAR 90 Infra-Red exhaust tester, enabling us to fine tailor adjustments that are crucial to the emissions. This type of tester also lets us know the exhaust content before the catalytic converter. When you tie all these areas together, you can either make an accurate diagnosis or a fine tailored adjustment.
