Council Briefed on MARC And Metro Start-up Plans

The MARC commuter rail station located at the future Greenbelt Metro station will be in service in August, 1992, Jerry Gough of Metro told the City Council at the regular June 8 council meeting. The station is on the line that runs from Union Station in Washington to Camden Yards in Baltimore.

For the Metro station itself, "we expect to meet our operations deadline of late 1993," said Gough. At that time the Metro green line will begin service from its terminus in Greenbelt, through the College Park, Prince Georges Plaza and West Hyattsville stations, to the Fort Totten station of the red line. "Gap trains" will run between regular red line trains to serve commuters transferring from the green line. The "inner green line," to a major transfer station at Gallery Place, will be completed later.

Station and Parking

John Grantham, Metro's resident engineer during construction, told council that he expects work on the station to be finished in October. Follow-on contracts have begun for mechanical and electrical work, escalators, elevators and laying the tracks. Breda Construction in Italy is now building the cars. As these are completed, they are being shipped to the United States and stored in the rail yard at Alexandria.

A 500-car interim parking lot will be ready in August to serve the MARC station. The permanent parking lot will be constructed under a 12-month contract, beginning in September. When the Metro station opens, parking will be available for 3.500 cars, with both regional and local kiss-and-ride and park-and-ride facilities.

Local access to the parking lot will be from Cherrywood Lane; regional access will be from the inner loop of the Beltway (coming from west of the station)

For the Metro station itself, and to the outer loop (heading we expect to meet our operations deadline of late 1993," said to see who would use the Beltway, who live east of the Greenbelt station are expected to continue using the New Carrollton station.

Until the Metro station opens, parking will be free at the MARC lot; parking fees are expected to be around \$1.50 throughout the lot once Metro opens, although free on weekends.

B-W Parkway Ramp Closings

On June 20, weather permitting, the southbound lanes of the Baltimore Washington Parkway will be shifted to the left toward the median onto new pavement. For the past few months, the traffic has been shifted to the right onto temporary pavement.

The on-ramp from Scuthway onto southbound parkway will be closed during the day in order to make the move. People wishing to go south on the Parkway should go west on Greenbelt Road and use the Kenilworth exit onto the beltway and then back to the Parkway southbound. Southbound Parkway and Southway traffic will experience major delays.

The Northbound lanes will not be affected by this operation. Variable message signs are in place for the southbound parkway traffic and Southway traffic-Please observe the messages displayed.

On June 27, the northbound lanes are expected to be shifted, weather permitting.

Bomb Threat at Roosevelt Creates Bother, No Booms

On Wednesday, June 10, Eleanor Roosevelt High School received a bomb threat. The call came in at approximately 3:45 p.m. — 15 minutes before the end of school. After the school was evacuated and searched, no bomb was found. Police have no suspects.

Dr. Gerald Boarman, principal, was not at the school at the time. The situation was handled by administrator Dr. Dorothy Harrison. Roosevelt secretary Mickey Devaney notified the county police who, along with the Greenbelt Police, helped evacuate the building.

According to Harrison, county guidelines state that in the event of this kind of an emergency, the first priority is to evacuate the school in a safe and orderly manner. The administrators did this by sounding a fire drill bell. Once the school was evacuated, administrators spoke to students and faculty outside, informing them of the situation.

Police sealed off the school building to keep people from going back inside and then police called the owner of a bomb-sniffing dog used by the fire department. Fire department officials arrived with the dog at 4:50 p.m.

"The bomb threat was an inconvenience to everyone," said Harrison. Final exams were being given when the threat was made; some students were not able to finish before the evacuation. (A few teachers had to nullify exams because of the possibility that some students discussed answers outside).

City Reviews Office Park Plans, OK's Lake Park Plan

Capital Office Park plans include three more buildings. At its June 8 meeting, the Greenbelt City Council heard a review of the proposal, approved the Buddy Attick Park Master Plan and urged the county to appeal the Sunrise project.

City planner Celia Wilson reported on the preliminary plan of subdivision for the remaining undeveloped acreage at Capital Office Park. The plan calls for creation of three buildable lots, with 568,000 square feet of office development, and one unbuildable lot containing floodplains, steep slopes and other environmental consraints.

Currently city staff, MNCPPC staff and the applicant are discussing the adequacy of public facilities. The developer may be asked to widen Kenilworth Avenue; install traffic signals at the intersections of Ivy Lane and Kenilworth, Cherrywood Lane and Kenilworth, and Ivy and Cherrywood; and undertake certain other improvements such as adding another dedicated left-turn lane at the Crescent Road and Kenilworth intersection.

According to Wilson, the developer is reluctant to pay for all of the improvements called for in the traffic study, feeling that other contributors to the increased traffic load, such as the Federal Courthouse and the Metro station, should also contribute to road improvements.

Also at issue is the adequacy of fire and police services. The current formula assesses whether the county can provide adequate services; city staff are arguing that the test should be applied to city resources only, since the city will be the primary provider of services.

Doug Love requested that bicycle lanes be considered in the planning for road improvements. Wilson said that the width of Cherrywood would allow for 12-foot-wide bike lanes, narrowing to five feet on the bridge over the Beltway.

Attick Master Plan

With very little discussion, council accepted the final draft of the Master Plan for Buddy Attick Park and established a 30-day period for public review and comments. Copies of the

after 4 p.m.—had to go home leaving their books and personal belongings in the sealed-off school. draft are available at the city offices and the library.

City Manager Daniel Hobbs called this period a chance for a final "reality check and validation, to ensure that the language in the draft doesn't stray from the intent of council."

Other Issues

Council also voted 4-0 to formally request that the county appeal the most recent court decision regarding the Sunrise Apartments project. (Council member Thomas X. White was unable to attend the meeting because of a death in the family).

The latest court of appeals decision had restored to the Sunrise developers the denser zoning in effect on the property before the Sectional Map Amendment (SMA) was adopted May 1, 1990. In the SMA, the site was changed from R-10 (residential with a maximum of 48 units per acre) to R-18-C (condominiums with a maximum of 12 units per acre).

The court had denied the city's standing to join the county's case or to file an amicus curiae brief; therefore, the city's only available input was to urge the county to continue the appeal process.

Council also: gave tentative approval for revised job descriptions for three city employee positions, awarded contracts for purchase of police vehicles and for 4th of July fireworks, adopted a proclamation concerning Flag Day, and congratulated city staff and citizens for the dedication of Schrom Hills Park.

Open Research

Open Research Road full-time. I want to drive to the Parkway off Powder Mill and go to Bal-timore, shopping in Laurel and other locations without a tour of GHI or the continually increasing traffic lights and industrialism of Greenbelt Road.

I am a GHI resident. I rush out of work to reach Research Road before it closes at 6 p.m. (6 p.m. is officially "dusk"). When I have an errand to run, I fail to reach the gate in time and am forced to take a 25-minute adventure down Greenbelt Road. If I stop at Greenway Center, it takes three traffic light patterns to be released from the parking lot. Changes in these traffic patterns and increased building in Bowie, Glenn Dale, Lanham and all other areas of Greenbelt have driven animals into the roads. Specifically, on Soil Conservation Road there is the new Goddard Drive development NASA's building clearing, a police training area (vans, dogs and firearm targets) behind a house type construction on Soil Conservation Road, and USDA road repairs and constructions have also impacted the

The recent implication that Soil Conservation to Powder Mill Road is a short cut reflects a parochial residential view which would like the city of Greenbelt to be disconnected from its environment (without regard to the increased population and congestion on Greenbelt Road). Lanham and Greenbelt East residents are bombarded by Greenbelt Road traffic. Soil Conservation Road is not a short-cut, it is the only alternative route.

Animal carcasses are seen on every road, including the Beltway, and if some people had their way they would close it as well. Closing one road will not resolve the problem. A mesh type fencing on Soil Conservation Road could be maintained periodically, as easily as a continuous gate keeper. I suggest lighting be provided on these roads to increase visibility.

People of Greenbelt Homes: The new school is going to increase traffic on Research Road. If Research Road is closed, there is one other route—through your town. Too late now-buses are transporting non-residents to school. I will be surprised if all the buses can miss all the suicidal squirrels! I've been lucky so Connie Houchens

Kangaroo Katie Gets Okay For Outdoor Barbecues

The Prince Georges County Board of Licenses has approved Kangaroo Katie's request to sell alcoholic beverages outside its restaurant in conjunction with a series of Friday night barbecues. The first "Shrimp on the Barbie" was held on June 12.

At its May 11 regular meeting, the Greenbelt City Council had unanimously voted to oppose Kangaroo Katie's request. This action by council was based upon its concerns about parking, crowd control and the effect on traffic and neighboring businesses.

Council gave special attention in its discussion to the request by Combined Properties, the company that owns the rest of Greenway Center, that the request be denied. Sheldon Gold-berg of Windsor Green spoke against the proposed event, saying it would make the already tight Friday night parking situation even worse. Both council member Antoinette M. Bram and Mayor Gil Weidenfeld said they would be more agreeable to a one or two-time trial, but were unwilling to agree to a regular series of events.

Traffic and crowds were another concern. Bram, predicting that Greenbelt Road drivers would be attracted by the event, held just off that road, questioned whether the resulting crowds could be controlled. Council member Edward Putens and Weidenfeld worried that similar businesses in the city would see this decision as a precedent and would request permission for similar events.

14 and 15 Year-Olds Winning at Baseball

The Greenbelt Boys & Girls Club is fielding two county boys baseball teams this season: a 14 and under team (boys born in 1978 and 79) and a 15-year-old team (boys born in 1977).

14 and Under

The 14 and under team is nearing the end of their season, having begun play on May 12. The team of 14 players has only three veterans of County ball—Peter Cone, Michael Garvey and Terence Towler. All of the other players never played on a 90-foot diamond before, most playing before this year on a Little League diamond.

After a shaky start for this young team, going 0-3 with a couple of tough losses, the team turned things around. As of June 12, the team has a 6-3 record with a couple of blow-outs under their belts—a 15-0 win over Forestville and a 17-4 win over Clinton No. 2.

Team leaders (as of 6/12) are: Robert Artman with 19 at-bats, 10 hits, 8 runs scored and 8 stolen bases; Neil Comparetto with 5 RBIs and 11 stolen bases; Cone with 17 at-bats and 8 hits; Armando Cremata with a .692 on-base average that includes 3 hits and 6 walks; Eric English with a .688 on-base average that includes 4 hits and 7 walks; Garvey with 6 hits and 5 walks; Bruce Lindsay with a .750 on-base average; and Towler with 15 at-bats, 10 hits, 4 walks, 7 runs scored, 7 RBIs, a .667 batting average, a .737 on-base average and 10 stolen bases.

Position

Artman and Cone are the main pitchers with Mike Carey and Towler doing most of the catching. Pete Campbell plays 2nd and catches; Comparetto plays shortstop and 1st; Cremata plays at 1st; English plays right field; Harry Flores plays center field; Garvey plays at 3rd and left field; Jeremy Holbrook pitches and plays 2nd; Gregg Jarboe plays left field and at 2nd; Lindsay plays left field; and T. J. Lubey plays shortstop. All have contributed to the team's success. The coaches for the 14 and under baseball team are Joe Ju-

nek, Mike Carey and Latana Kennedy (all rookies themselves). The team's final two games are home at Braden Field No. 1, Saturday, June 20, 9 a.m. vs. Bowie No. 2 and Monday, June 22, 6:15 p.m. vs. Kettering.

15-Year-Olds

The 15-year-old team started play on June 2, and as of June 15, has a 3-1 record. The team plays through July 16 with a 15-game schedule (plus playoffs). Opponents in the County's 15-year-old National League are Lewisdale, New Carrollton, Belts-ville, Landover Hills and Laurel.

Koh (RF), Brian Lappin (SS and 2nd), Scott Lubey (1st), Craig May (OF), Bob McNulty (OF), Miguel Pereira (OF and 2nd), and Neil Toomy (OF and 2nd). Mosquito Control

The Maryland Department of Agriculture will begin their mosquito control program in Greenbelt. Spraying will only be done if a request is received and the Department of Agriculture determines the area requested should be sprayed.

The city's Public Works Department, 474-8004, will take citizens' requests for mosquito spraying and pass them along to the Department of Agriculture. When making requests for mosquito spraying, it is important to specify the time of day

the mosquitos are the worst and describe the exact location of the problem area. Spraying will only be done once a week. To request that an area be sprayed, call 474-8004 by Friday, at noon to be included in spraying on the following Tuesday evening. If no requests are received, no areas will be sprayed.

Mosquitos breed in any water holding container, including bird baths, wading pools, pet watering dishes, tin cans, old tires, clogged gutters or flower pots. To prevent mosquito breeding in these areas, water should be changed weekly, gutters cleaned

out and other water holding containers should be disposed of or stored upside down.




